She recently served as the 2009-2010 Staff Representative to the University of Kentucky Board of Trustees. She works closely with the University of Kentucky Institute for Workplace Innovation (iWin) on various employee engagement initiatives, such as implementation of flexible work arrangements and the aging workforce. Prior to her employment at the University of Kentucky, Robynn worked as the Program Administrator for the Lexington-Fayette Urban-County Government Office of Aging Services and Projects Director for the Nursing Home Ombudsman Agency of the Bluegrass. Her primary responsibilities included publication of a region-wide aging services directory, oversight of the local Senior Citizens Center and community outreach on aging issues. Additionally, she has over four years of experience as a Children's Program Director for the YMCA and five years teaching English as a Second Language. Robynn has a doctorate in Sociology from the University of Kentucky and a Certificate in Gerontology from the University of Kentucky Sanders Brown Center on Aging.
